ORDER OF NAVARRO COUNTY JUDGE DECLARING A LOCAL STATE OF DISASTER DUE TO PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY

SHERRY DOWD, County Clark
NAMARRO COUNTY, TEXAS

APR 0.8 2020

WHEREAS, beginning in December 2019, a novel coronavirus, now designated SARS- CoV2 which causes the disease COVID-19, has been declared a global pandemic by the World Health Organization; and

WHEREAS, the symptoms of COVID-19 can range from mild to severe illness and cause further complications including death; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 virus mainly spreads between people who are in close contact with one another through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs or sneezes; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the Governor of the State of Texas issued a proclamation certifying that COVID-19 poses an imminent threat of disaster in the state and declaring a state of disaster for all counties in Texas; and

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2020, the Governor of the State of Texas issued a proclamation making certain recommendations mandatory; and

WHEREAS, THE COUNTY OF NAVARRO, Texas, is taking extraordinary measures to prevent the spread of this potentially devastating disease in our community; and

WHEREAS, said state of disaster requires that certain emergency protective measures be taken pursuant to the Texas Disaster Act of 1975 relating to Emergency Management and Public Health, pursuant to Chapter 418 of the Texas Government Code.

WHEREAS, at his March 22, 2020 press conference, the Governor acknowledged that the urban centers may need to enact more stringent measures to address this public health emergency and stated that he would applaud the cities for doing so; and

WHEREAS, on March 23, 2020 Navarro County Judge, H.M. Davenport, Jr. affirmed the Governor's orders to avoid gatherings of more than 10 persons; avoid dining in at bar, restaurants, food courts; avoid visiting gyms and massage parlors; avoid visiting retirement and long-term care facilities and temporarily close school through May 4, 2020; and

WHEREAS, because of the risk of the rapid spread of the virus, the need to protect the most vulnerable members of the community, the intent to ensure that the maximum number of people self-isolate in their places of residence to the maximum extent feasible, while enabling essential services to continue, and the desire to slow the spread of COVID-19 to the maximum extent possible, this Order is required; and

WHEREAS, this Order is issued based on evidence of increasing occurrence of COVID-19 within the State of Texas and throughout the Central Texas area, scientific evidence and best practices regarding the most effective approaches to slow the transmission of communicable diseases generally and COVID-19 specifically, and evidence that the age, condition, and health of a significant portion of the population of the County places it at risk for serious health complications, including death, from COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, making the problem worse, some individuals who contract the COVID-19 virus have no symptoms or have mild symptoms, which means they may not be aware they carry the virus; and

WHEREAS, because even people without symptoms can transmit the disease, and because evidence shows the disease is easily spread, gatherings can result in preventable transmission of the virus; and

WHEREAS, the scientific evidence shows that at this stage of the emergency, it is essential to slow virus transmission as much as possible to protect the most vulnerable and to prevent the health care system from being overwhelmed. One proven way to slow the transmission is to limit interactions among people to the greatest extent practicable. By reducing the spread of the COVID-19 virus, this Order helps preserve critical and limited healthcare capacity in the County; and

WHEREAS, local health officials, the local hospitals, are all calling for this action to flatten the curve of the virus transmission, and have warned that not taking action could result in the medical resources being overcome; and

WHEREAS, a declaration of local disaster and public health emergency includes the ability to reduce the possibility of exposure to disease, control the risk, promote health, compel persons to undergo additional health measures that prevent or control the spread of disease, including isolation, surveillance, quarantine, or placement of persons under public health observation; and

WHEREAS, I, H. M. Davenport, Jr., have determined that extraordinary and immediate measures must be taken to respond quickly to prevent and slow down community spread of COVID- 19; and,

WHEREAS, On March 31 Governor Greg Abbott issued Executive Order GA-14 relating to statewide continuity of essential services and activities during the COVID-19 disaster;

NOW THEREFORE, AS THE NAVARRO COUNTY JUDGE, I DO HEREBY PROCLAIM: UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF TEXAS GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 418.108 AND HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE SECTION 122.006:

SECTION 1. That a local state of disaster for public health emergency is hereby declared and continued for the COUNTY OF NAVARRO, Texas, pursuant to Section 418.108(a) of the Texas Government Code.

SECTION 2. That pursuant to Section 418.108(b) of the Texas Government Code the state of disaster for public health emergency shall continue until terminated by law or by action of the NAVARRO COUNTY JUDGE **OR** THE NAVARRO COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT.

SECTION 3. That pursuant to Section 418.108(c) of the Texas Government Code this declaration of a local state of disaster for public health emergency shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the NAVARRO COUNTY CLERK.

SECTION 4. That pursuant to Section 418.108(d) of the Texas Government Code, this declaration of a local state of disaster activates the COUNTY OF NAVARRO, Texas, Emergency Management Plan, and authorizes the furnishing of aid and assistance under the declaration.

SECTION 5. That this declaration authorizes the COUNTY to take any actions necessary to promote health and suppress the virus, including the quarantine of persons and occupied structures, examining and regulating hospitals, regulating ingress and egress to occupied structures, establishment of quarantine stations, emergency hospitals, and other hospitals, and insuring compliance for those who do not comply with the COUNTY's rules, pursuant to Section 122.006 of the Health and Safety Code.

SECTION 6. In accordance with Texas Government Code §418.173, a person who knowingly or intentionally violates this declaration commits an offense, punishable by a fine up to \$1,000.00 or confinement in jail for a term that does not exceed 180 days.

SECTION 7. That this declaration hereby authorizes the use of all lawfully available enforcement tools.

SECTION 8. That this declaration shall take effect midnight (11:59 pm) April 8, 2020 and shall continue until midnight (11:59 pm) April 30, 2020 unless terminated by law or by action of the Navarro County Judge or Commissioners Court of Navarro County.

SECTION 9. The foregoing recitals are incorporated herein and made findings of fact.

That a local state of disaster and public health emergency is hereby declared for the COUNTY OF NAVARRO, Texas.

Pursuant to §418.108(b) of the Texas Government Code, the state of disaster shall continue for a period of not more than seven days from the date of **April 8, 2020**, unless approved by the NAVARRO COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT.

All individuals currently living within the COUNTY OF NAVARRO, Texas (the County) are ordered to shelter at their place of residence. To the extent individuals are using shared or outdoor spaces, they must at all times as reasonably possible maintain social distancing of at least six feet from any other person when they are outside their residence. All persons may leave their residences only for Essential Activities, Essential Governmental Functions, or to operate Essential Businesses, all as defined in Section 10. Individuals experiencing homelessness are exempt from this Section, but are strongly urged to obtain shelter, and entities are strongly urged to make such shelter available as soon as possible and to the maximum extent practicable (and to utilize Social Distancing Requirements in their operation).

All businesses with a facility in the County, except Essential Businesses as defined below in Section 10, are required to cease all activities at facilities located within the County except Minimum Basic Operations, as defined in Section 10. For clarity, businesses may also continue operations consisting exclusively of employees or contractors performing activities at their own residences (i.e., working from home). All Essential Businesses are strongly encouraged to remain open, however, even Essential Businesses are encouraged to determine essential staff necessary to operate and send non-essential staff home. To the greatest extent feasible, Essential Businesses shall comply with Social Distancing Requirements as defined in Section 10 below, including, but not limited to, when any customers are standing in line.

All public and private gatherings of any number of people occurring outside a household or living unit are prohibited, except for the limited purposes as expressly permitted in Section 10. Nothing in this Order prohibits the gathering of members of a household or living unit.

All travel, except Essential Travel and Essential Activities as defined below in Section 10, is prohibited. People must use public transit only for purposes of performing Essential Activities or to travel to and from work to operate Essential Businesses or maintain Essential Governmental Functions. People riding on public transit must comply with Social Distancing Requirements as defined in Section 10 below, to the greatest extent feasible. This Order allows travel into or out of the City to perform Essential Activities, operate Essential Businesses, or maintain Essential Governmental Functions.

SECTION 10. Definitions and Exemptions.

- a. For purposes of this Order, individuals may leave their residence only to perform any of the following "Essential Activities:"
- To engage in activities or perform tasks essential to their health and safety, or to the health and safety of their family or household members (including, but not limited to, pets), such as, by way of example only and without limitation, obtaining medical supplies or medication, visiting a health care professional, or obtaining supplies they need to work from home;
- To obtain necessary services or supplies for themselves and their family or household members, or to deliver those services or supplies to others, such as, by way of example only and without limitation, canned food, dry goods, fresh fruits and vegetables, pet supply, fresh meats, fish, and poultry, and any other household consumer products, and products necessary to maintain the safety, sanitation, and essential operation of residences;
- To engage in outdoor activity, such as, by way of example and without limitation, walking, hiking, running, hunting, fishing, golfing or riding a bicycle. Except for members of a residence who are sheltering together, the individuals shall comply with Social Distancing Requirements as defined in this Section;
- To perform work providing essential products and services at an Essential Business or to otherwise carry out activities specifically permitted in this Order, including Minimum Basic Operations; and
- To care for a family member or pet in another household.

But people at high risk of severe illness from COVID-19 and people who are sick are urged to stay in their residence to the extent possible except as necessary to seek medical care.

- b. For purposes of this Order, individuals may leave their residence to work for or obtain services at any "Healthcare Operations" including hospitals, clinics, dentists, pharmacies, pharmaceutical, and biotechnology companies, other healthcare facilities, healthcare suppliers, home healthcare services providers, mental health providers, or any related and/or ancillary healthcare services. "Healthcare Operations" also includes veterinary care and all healthcare services provided to animals. This exemption shall be construed broadly to avoid any impacts to the delivery of healthcare, broadly defined. "Healthcare Operations" does not include fitness and exercise gyms and similar facilities.
- c. For purposes of this Order, individuals may leave their residence to provide any services or perform any work necessary to the operations and maintenance of "Essential Infrastructure," including, but not limited to, construction, airport operations, water, sewer, gas, electrical, oil refining, roads and highways, public transportation, solid waste collection and removal, internet, and telecommunications systems (including the provision of essential global, national, and local infrastructure for computing services, business infrastructure, communications, and web-based services), provided that they carry out those services or

that work in compliance with Social Distancing Requirements as defined in this Section, to the extent possible.

- d. For purposes of this Order, all first responders, emergency management personnel, Emergency dispatchers, court personnel, and law enforcement personnel, and others who need to perform essential services are categorically exempt from this Order. Further, nothing in this Order shall prohibit any individual from preforming or accessing "Essential Governmental Functions", as determined by the governmental entity performing those functions. Each governmental entity shall identify and designate appropriate employees or contractors to continue providing and carrying out any Essential Governmental Functions. All Essential Governmental Functions shall be performed in compliance with Social Distancing Requirements as defined in this Section, to the extent possible.
- e. For the purposes of this Order, covered businesses include any for-profit, non-profit, or educational entities, regardless of the nature of the service, the function they preform, or its corporate or entity structure.
- f. For the purposes of this Order, "Essential Businesses" means as defined in the most recent guidelines as issued by Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) and herein:
 - i. Healthcare Operations and Essential Infrastructure:
 - j. Grocery stores, certified farmer's markets, farm and produce stands, supermarkets, food banks, convenience stores, and other establishments engaged in the retail sale of canned food, dry goods, fresh fruits and vegetables, pet supply, fresh meats, fish, and poultry, and any other household consumer products (such as cleaning and personal care products), and liquor stores. This includes stores that sell groceries and also sell other non-grocery products, and products necessary to maintaining the safety, sanitation, and essential operation of residences. Of the above-mentioned essential businesses that are allowed to continue to operate the following regulations shall apply:
 - 1. Businesses should establish a daily plan for shopping by customers age 65 and over.
 - 2. Establish controls to require a minimum distance of six feet or more between patrons in lines waiting in front of and inside the establishment and shall implement a system of service (such as a color coded or numerical) that discourages queuing in a long line in the parking lot.
 - 3. Maximum occupancy shall be 20 percent of the allowable under current codes, excluding employees.
 - 4. Limit family members entering occupancy to 2 per family. Store manager may maintain discretion in this matter.
 - iii. Food cultivation, including farming, livestock, and fishing;

- iv. Businesses that provide food, shelter, and social services, and other necessities of life for economically disadvantaged or otherwise needy individuals;
- v. Newspapers, television, radio, and other media services;
- vi. Gas stations and auto-supply, auto-repair, and related facilities; Automatic and Manual Carwashes can remain open with the following caveats:
- 1. Signage about disinfecting or cleaning of wands and kiosks such as "To ensure your safety clean before use"
- 2. Promote and Enforce Social Distancing mandate
- 3. Attendants should limit interactions with public (cleaning of equipment is acceptable)
- 4. Have a method to sanitize or clean surfaces regularly touched by public
- 5. No manual vacuum shall be used hoses should be disconnected
 - vii. Banks and related financial institutions;
 - viii. Hardware and construction supply stores;
- vix. Plumbers, electricians, exterminators, and other service providers who provide services that are necessary to maintaining the safety, sanitation, and essential operation of residences, Essential Activities, and Essential Businesses;
 - x. Businesses providing mailing and shipping services, including post office boxes;
 - xi. Laundromats, drycleaners, and laundry service providers;
- xii. Restaurants and other facilities that prepare and serve food, but only for delivery or carry out. Schools and other entities that typically provide food services to students or members of the public may continue to do so under this Order on the condition that the food is provided to students or members of the public on a pick-up or take-away basis only. Schools and other entities that provide food services under this exemption shall not permit the food to be eaten at the site where it is provided, or at any other gathering site.

Note: Patrons may not wait inside a restaurant for their food orders. If there is a line or gathering of persons (outside of their vehicles) waiting to be served, this places everyone in the line or gathering at a higher risk of transmission of COVID-19. Restaurants are urged to create a system that does not involve such lines or gatherings of people waiting to order or waiting to receive their order. For example, a system where the customers call in their order and stay in or at their vehicles until notified that their order is ready --with only one customer at the transaction point at a time, or other methods that assure that the purposes of this Order and Declaration are served is necessary. Stressing the need for call ahead or internet ordering will also cut down on waiting time and could be used in conjunction with the customer calling in or texting when he or she has arrived to allow for straight to vehicle service. If lines cannot be avoided, it shall be the restaurant management's responsibility to assure that safe Social Distancing is practiced. This also applies to food trucks;

- xiii. Businesses that supply products needed for people to work from home;
- xiv. Businesses that supply other essential businesses with the support or supplies necessary to operate;
 - xv. Businesses that ship or deliver groceries, food, goods or services directly to residences;
- xvi. Airlines, taxis, and other private transportation providers providing transportation services necessary for Essential Activities and other purposes expressly authorized in this Order;
 - xvii. Home-based care for seniors, adults, or children;
 - xviii. Residential facilities and shelters for seniors, adults, and children;
- xix. Professional services: legal, accounting, insurance, real estate services (including appraisal, survey, and title services including closings—Showings and open houses are prohibited however, virtual showings utilizing internet and multimedia are permissible;
- xx. Childcare facilities providing services that enable employees exempted in this Order to work as permitted. To the extent possible, childcare facilities must operate under the following mandatory conditions:
 - a. Childcare must be carried out in stable groups of 12 or fewer ("stable" means that the same 12 or fewer children are in the same group each day);
 - b. Children shall not change from one group to another;
 - c. If more than one group of children is cared for at one facility, each group shall be in a separate area and shall not mix with each other; and
 - d. Childcare providers shall remain solely with one group of children;
- xxi. Utilities, telecommunications, trash collection and disposal, law enforcement, EMS/ambulance, corrections, dispatch, animal shelters, governmental employees who have not been specifically deemed non-essential and sent home by the government entity;
- xxii. Janitorial and maintenance services, funeral industry (funerals services shall be graveside only with groups of less than 10 and with social distancing requirements in effect), defense industry, space and technology industry, technology support, and scientific research; and
- xxiii. Religious services provided in residences, Healthcare Operations, at funerals, or provided online while being broadcast from a religious facility;
- xxiv. Houses of worship should, whenever possible, conduct their activities from home or through remote audio or video services. Houses of worship should limit staff to ten or less to conduct remote services. All providers of essential services, including houses of worship MUST follow certain mitigation strategies to slow the spread of the virus. If a house of worship cannot conduct its activities remotely, then the White House and CDC guidelines, relating to social distancing, maintaining good hygiene by washing your hands and cleaning and disinfecting work areas frequently shall be

implemented. Houses of worship should limit congregation to ten people or less with social distancing mandates enforced when services cannot be conducted remotely. Per Attorney General Guidance for Houses of Worship during the COVID-19 Crisis, these restrictions do not violate the religious liberty of houses of worship.

- g. For the purposes of this Order, Minimum Basic Operations include the following, provided that employees comply with Social Distancing Requirements as defined this Section, to the extent possible, while carrying out such operations:
- i. The minimum necessary activities to maintain the value of the business's inventory, ensure security, process payroll and employee benefits, or for related functions; and
- ii. The minimum necessary activities to facilitate employees of the business being able to continue to work remotely from their residences.
- h. For the purposes of this Order, "Essential Travel" includes travel for any of the following purposes:
- i. Any travel related to the provision of or access to Essential Activities, Essential Governmental Functions, Essential Businesses, or Minimum Basic Operations;
- ii. Travel to care for elderly, minors, dependents, persons with disabilities, or other vulnerable persons;
- iii. Travel to or from educational institutions for purposes of receiving materials for distance learning, for receiving meals, and any other related services;
 - iv. Travel to return to a place of residence from outside the jurisdiction;
 - v. Travel required by law enforcement or court Order; or
- vi. Travel required for non-residents to return to their place of residence outside the COUNTY. individuals are strongly encouraged to verify that their transportation out of the COUNTY remains available and functional prior to commencing such travel.

Individuals engaged in any Essential Travel must comply with all Social distancing Requirements as defined in this Section.

- i. For purposes of this Order, residences include hotels, motels, shared rental units, and similar facilities.
- j. For purposes of this Order, "Social Distancing Requirements" includes maintaining at least six-foot social distancing from other individuals, washing hands with soap and water for at least twenty seconds as frequently as possible or using hand sanitizer, covering coughs or sneezes (into the sleeve or elbow, not hands), regularly cleaning high-touch surfaces, not shaking hands, and wearing personal protection to include masks.

SECTION 11. Non-essential businesses shall shut down except for maintaining Minimum Basic Operations as defined herein. Essential Businesses exempted from shut-down are encouraged to determine staff who are essential to operations, and to send non-essential staff home

SECTION 12. When people need to leave their places of residence, whether to obtain or perform vital services, or to otherwise facilitate authorized activities necessary for continuity of social and commercial life, they should at all times reasonably possible comply with Social Distancing Requirements as defined in Section 10 above.

SECTION 13. Any manufacturer who retools so that a substantial part of their business is for the purpose of manufacturing and producing ventilators, medical PPE and hand sanitizer may apply for an "essential business" exemption under this Order.

SECTION 14. Grocery stores, supermarkets, warehouse stores, hospitals, and medical facilities are experiencing high levels of demand for a large number of products, requiring more deliveries from manufacturers and distribution centers to serve their customers. A number of Texas cities and local associations have implemented restrictions on delivery hours to stores to mitigate truck noise and traffic. Due to the need to deliver products as quickly and efficiently as possible during this critical timeframe, this Order hereby suspends all delivery hour restrictions for transport to or from any entity involved in the selling or distribution of food products, medicine, or medical supplies in County of Navarro, Texas, for the next 60 days.

SECTION 15. If someone in a household has tested positive for coronavirus, the household is ordered to isolate at home. Members of the household cannot go to work, school, or any other community function.

SECTION 16. Nursing homes, retirement, and long-term care facilities are instructed by this order to prohibit non-essential visitors from accessing their facilities unless to provide critical assistance or for end-of-life visitation.

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY OF NAVARRO, TEXAS, APPROVING THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF AN AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF NAVARRO, TEXAS AND BRICK STREET HOLDINGS, LLC FOR A PROPERTY TAX ABATEMENT IN THE CORSICANA DOWNTOWN REVITALIZATION DISTRICT, AND AUTHORIZING ITS EXECUTION BY THE COUNTY JUDGE; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court has been presented a proposed tax abatement agreement between the County of Navarro, Texas and Brick Street Holdings, LLC providing for a property tax abatement for certain improvements, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference (hereinafter called "AGREEMENT"); and

WHEREAS, upon full review and consideration of the AGREEMENT, and all matters attendant and related thereto, the County Commissioners Court is of the opinion that the terms and conditions thereof should be approved, and that the County Judge shall be authorized to execute it on behalf of the County of Navarro.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF THE **COUNTY OF NAVARRO, TEXAS:**

- Section 1. The terms and conditions of the proposed AGREEMENT, having been reviewed by the Commissioners Court of Navarro and found to be acceptable and in the best interests of the County of Navarro and its citizens, are hereby in all things approved.
- Section 2. The County Judge is hereby authorized to execute the AGREEMENT and all other documents in connection therewith on behalf of the County of Navarro, substantially according to the terms and conditions set forth in the AGREEMENT.
- Section 3. That this approval and execution of the AGREEMENT on behalf of the County of Navarro is not conditional upon approval and execution of any other tax abatement agreement by any other taxing entity.
 - Section 4. This Resolution shall become effective from and after its passage.

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TAX ABATEMENT AGREEMENT

This Tax Abatement Agreement (the "Agreement") is entered into by and between the County of Navarro, a political subdivision of the State of Texas, acting herein by and through its County Judge and hereinafter referred to as COUNTY, and Brick Street Holdings, LLC, hereinafter referred to as OWNER.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, on the 11th day of February, 2019, the City Council of CITY passed an Ordinance creating and designating the Corsicana Downtown Revitalization District (the "Reinvestment Zone") for commercial tax abatement, as authorized by Chapter 312, Texas Tax Code; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY has previously adopted a Tax Abatement Policy (the "Tax Abatement Policy") and a Historic Downtown Tax Abatement Program; and

WHEREAS, the Historic Downtown Tax Abatement Program constitutes appropriate guidelines and criteria governing tax abatement agreements to be entered into by COUNTY as required by Chapter 312, Texas Tax Code; and

WHEREAS, COUNTY has adopted a resolution stating that it elects to be eligible to participate in tax abatement; and

WHEREAS, CITY has sent written notice that CITY intends to enter into this AGREEMENT, including a copy of this AGREEMENT, to the presiding officer of the governing body of each other taxing unit in which property to be subject to this AGREEMENT is located, as required by Section 312.2041 of the Texas Tax Code; and

WHEREAS, in order to maintain and/or enhance the commercial economic and employment base of the Corsicana area to the long term interest and benefit of the COUNTY, the COUNTY has determined that the contemplated use of the PROPERTY, as hereinafter defined, the contemplated improvements to the PROPERTY in the amount as set forth in this AGREEMENT, and the other terms hereof are consistent with encouraging development of said Reinvestment Zone in accordance with the purposes for its creation and are in compliance with COUNTY'S Historic Downtown Tax Abatement Program;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual benefits and promises contained herein and for good and other valuable consideration, the adequacy and receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto do mutually agree as follows:

I. DEFINITIONS

Whenever used in this Agreement, the following terms shall have the meanings ascribed to them:

- 1.1 "Estimated Tax Value" means the estimated depreciated Tax Net Book Values applicable to the real property improvements and the Tangible Personal Property improvements comprising the Investment described in Paragraph 2.2 below. For reference purposes, the Estimated Tax Values scheduled on are determined using the Navarro Central Appraisal District's appraisal guidelines in effect as of the date of this Agreement.
- 1.2 "Event of Bankruptcy or Insolvency" means the dissolution or termination of a party's existence as a going business, insolvency, appointment of receiver for any part of a party's property and such appointment is not terminated within ninety (90) days after such appointment is initially made, any general assignment for the benefit of creditors, or the commencement of any proceeding under any bankruptcy or insolvency laws by or against such party and such proceeding is not dismissed within ninety (90) days after the filing thereof.
- 1.3 "Force Majeure" means any contingency or cause beyond the reasonable control of OWNER including, without limitation, acts of God or the public enemy, war, riot; civil commotion, insurrection, adverse weather, governmental or de facto governmental action (unless caused by acts or omissions of OWNER), fires; explosions or floods, and strikes.
- 1.4 "In Service Project Cost" means the initial project cost of the Improvements identified and defined below, as of the date such Improvements are first placed into service by OWNER.
- 1.5 "Tangible Personal Property" means tangible personal property classified as such under state law and hereafter located on the Property, but expressly excludes inventory and supplies, and any tangible personal property that was located in the Reinvestment Zone at any time before the date of this Agreement.
- 1.6 "<u>Taxable Value</u>" means the appraised value as certified by the Navarro County Appraisal District as of January 1 of a given year.

Other terms defined elsewhere in this Agreement shall have the meanings therein ascribed to those terms.

II. OWNER'S OBLIGATIONS

2.1 The specific property to be the subject of this Agreement shall be the Real Property, including land and improvements, located at 319 N. Beaton Street in Corsicana, described as, Property ID No. 35014, and by map attached hereto as EXHIBIT A and made a part hereof, and shall be herein referred to as the PROPERTY.

- 2.2 For the purposes of fulfilling this Agreement, the OWNER shall make improvements to the real property as described in Exhibit "C" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference (collectively the "Improvements"), having a total In Service Project Cost of at least \$20,000. On or before December 31, 2019, OWNER shall substantially complete all Improvements. Notwithstanding the foregoing deadlines, OWNER shall have such additional time to satisfy the obligations contained in this Paragraph 2.2 as may reasonably be required in the event of Force Majeure if OWNER is diligently and faithfully pursuing satisfaction of the applicable obligation. The date of substantial completion of the Improvements shall be defined as the date a Certificate of Occupancy is issued by the CITY.
- 2.3 As good and valuable consideration for this Agreement, OWNER agrees and covenants that he will diligently and faithfully pursue the completion of the Improvements in a good and workmanlike manner. OWNER further covenants and agrees that all construction of the Improvements and use of the Property will be in accordance with all applicable State and local laws, codes, and regulations (or valid waiver thereof).
- OWNER further agrees that the COUNTY, its agents and employees shall have reasonable right of access to the Property, upon not less than ten (10) days prior written notice, to inspect the Improvements in order to ensure that the construction of the Improvements is in accordance with this Agreement and all applicable State and local laws and regulations (or valid waiver thereof). After completion of the Improvements, the COUNTY shall have the continuing right to inspect the Property, upon not less than ten (10) days prior written notice, to ensure that it is thereafter maintained in accordance with this Agreement throughout the Term of this Agreement. In addition, the OWNER agrees that appraisal district representatives shall have reasonable right of access to the Property, upon not less than ten (10) days prior written notice, for the purpose of ad valorem property tax appraisal for all real property and improvements to real property.

III. ABATEMENT OF TAXES

- 3.1 Subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, and subject to the rights of holders of any outstanding bonds of the COUNTY, a portion of ad valorem real property taxes from the Property that are otherwise owed to the COUNTY, shall be frozen at the appraised value of the Property on December 31, 2019. Said ad valorem real property tax abatement/freeze shall be for a five (5) year term, beginning in tax year 2020, and shall apply to the taxes assessed upon the increased value of the eligible Property, after installation of the real property improvements contemplated by Paragraph 2.2, over the value of the Property in the year in which this Agreement is executed; all subject to and in accordance with the terms of this Agreement, the Tax Abatement Policy, Chapter 312, Texas Tax Code, and all applicable state and local regulations (or valid waiver thereat).
- 3.2 It is understood and agreed among the parties that the Property shall be appraised at market value for the purposes of the applicable real property tax assessments effective as of December 31, 2019, and continued at market value until the expiration of the Term of this Agreement.
- 3.3 It is understood and agreed among the parties that, at the end of the Abatement term, the real property must remain on the tax rolls at the full appraised value for a minimum of ten (10) years before the property is eligible for tax abatement again.

IV. TERM OF THE AGREEMENT

- 4.1 The term of this Agreement (the "Term") shall begin on the date of this Agreement and end upon completion of the final abatement year.
- 4.2 Prior to December 1st of each year during the Term of this Agreement, OWNER shall certify to the governing body of the CITY, on behalf of each taxing unit, that OWNER is in compliance with all of the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

V. DEFAULT AND RECAPTURE OF ABATED TAX

- 5.1 In the event that (a) OWNER fails to incur the minimum In Service Project Cost of an amount that, at a minimum, is equal to 20 percent of the most recent valuation of the property, or \$20,000, whichever is less; (b) OWNER allows its ad valorem taxes owed the COUNTY to become delinquent and fails to timely and properly follow the legal procedures for protest and/or contest of any such ad valorem taxes; (c) OWNER has an Event of Bankruptcy or Insolvency (as defined in Paragraph 1.2); or (d) OWNER otherwise fails to comply with any of the terms, conditions, or obligations of this Agreement, then this Agreement shall be in default.
- In the event of default, COUNTY shall give the OWNER written notice of such default and, if the OWNER has not cured such default within sixty (60) days after said written notice, this Agreement may be terminated by the COUNTY. If the COUNTY terminates this Agreement in the event of default, OWNER shall repay to the COUNTY all taxes which otherwise would have been paid to the COUNTY without the benefit of abatement during the Term of this Agreement, together with interest at the statutory rate for delinquent taxes as determined by Section 33.01 of the Texas Tax Code (but without the addition of penalty), reasonable attorney's fees, and costs. Such amounts shall be due, owing, and payable to the COUNTY within sixty (60) days after the expiration of the above mentioned 60-day cure period. The parties acknowledge that COUNTY will suffer damages in the event of OWNER's default under this Agreement. The parties acknowledge that actual damages in the event of default and termination would be speculative and difficult to determine. OWNER's obligation to pay any amounts hereunder shall survive termination of this Agreement.
- 5.3 It is expressly acknowledged and agreed between the parties that the COUNTY shall have the right to place a tax lien against the Property pursuant to Section 32.01 of the Texas Tax Code. Such lien shall secure the payment of all taxes abated and subject to recapture under this Agreement, together with all other amounts payable hereunder. Any such lien may be fully enforced pursuant to the provisions of the Texas Tax Code. Also, to collect any amounts payable hereunder, the COUNTY shall have all other remedies provided generally in the Tax Code for the collection of delinquent property tax.

VI. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 6.1 The COUNTY represents and warrants that the Property does not include any property that is owned by a member of the County Commissioners Court approving, or having responsibility for the approval of this Agreement.
- 6.2 The terms and conditions of the Agreement are binding upon the successors and permitted assigns of all parties hereto. This Agreement may not be assigned by OWNER without the prior written consent of the COUNTY, such consent to be at the sole discretion of the COUNTY; provided, however, that upon written notice to the COUNTY, OWNER may assign its rights under this Agreement to a wholly owned subsidiary of OWNER, subject to OWNER remaining liable for all of its obligations hereunder.
- 6.3 It is understood and agreed between the parties that the OWNER, in performing its obligations hereunder, is acting independently, and the COUNTY assumes no responsibility or liability in connection therewith to third parties and OWNER agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the COUNTY therefrom. It is further understood and agreed among the parties that the COUNTY, in performing its obligations hereunder, is acting independently, and the OWNER assumes no responsibility or liability in connection therewith to third parties and the COUNTY agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the OWNER therefrom.
- Notices required to be given to any party to this Agreement shall be given personally or by certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, addressed to the party at its address set forth below, and given by mail, shall be deemed delivered as of the date personally delivered or three days after deposit in the United States mail:

For COUNTY, by notice to:

City of Corsicana, Texas Attention: City Manager Corsicana Government Center 200 North 12th Street Corsicana, Texas 75110 For OWNER, by notice to:

Brick Street Holdings, LLC 319 N. Beaton Stret Corsicana, Texas 75110

Any party may change the address to which notices are to be sent by giving the other party written notice in the manner provided in this Section.

- 6.5 This Agreement constitutes the entire and final expression of the agreement of the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof. This Agreement can be modified or amended only by a written agreement executed by both parties.
- 6.6 If either party commences an action against the other party arising out of or in connection with this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from the other party reasonable attorneys' fees and costs of suit.
- 6.7 This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas, without regard to its choice

of law rules. This Agreement is performable in Navarro County, Texas. Exclusive venue for any litigation related to, or arising out of, this Agreement shall lie in Navarro County, Texas.

- 6.8 In this Agreement, time is of the essence.
- 6.9 This Agreement may be executed simultaneously in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.
- This Agreement was authorized by resolution of the Commissioners Court at its regularly 6.10 scheduled meeting on the 13th day of April, 2020, authorizing the County Judge to execute the Agreement on behalf of the COUNTY.
- This AGREEMENT shall constitute a valid and binding agreement between the COUNTY 6.11 and OWNER when executed in accordance herewith, regardless of whether any other taxing unit executes a similar agreement for tax abatement.





The County will comply with the IRS with regard to fringe benefits such as county uniforms, county vehicle usage and day-trip meals. You may be responsible for paying payroll taxes on such fringe benefits.

2A-3 COMPENSATION

The County Commissioners Court annually sets the maximum compensation for each employee in accordance with Texas State Law.

The County complies with the Fair Labor Standards Acts as outlined in the Fair Labor Standards Safe Harbor policy.

Law Enforcement personnel are treated in accordance with the 207(k) exemption under the Fair Labor Standards Act. The Commissioners Court has adopted this exemption.

All non-exempt County employees shall be paid an hourly wage.

Temporary employees shall be paid hourly at least the minimum wage established by the Fair Labor Standards Act, as amended.

2A-4 ADMINISTRATIVE TIME

Elected Officials may put their employees on Administrative time at their discretion. Administrative time with pay may not exceed 80 hours without prior approval of Commissioners Court. In the event of a health care emergency or other disaster declaration in Navarro County, prior approval to exceed 80 hours is not required.

2A-5 PAYROLL DEDUCTIONS

Deductions shall be made from each employee's paycheck for federal withholding, social security, Medicare, and any other deductions required by law. Employees eligible for membership in the Texas County and District Retirement System shall have their contributions to that system deducted from each paycheck. Any optional deduction authorized by the Commissioners' Court and approved by the employee shall also be made from the employee's paycheck. No optional deduction shall be made from an employee's paycheck unless the employee turns in written authorization for the deduction to the County Treasurer's Office.

1D-6 Infectious Disease Control Policy

Navarro County will take proactive steps to protect the workplace in the event of an infectious disease outbreak. It is the goal of Navarro County during any such time period to strive to operate effectively and ensure that all essential services are continuously provided and that employees are safe within the workplace.

Navarro County is committed to providing authoritative information about the nature and spread of infectious diseases, including symptoms and signs to watch for, as well as required steps to be taken in the event of an illness or outbreak.

Preventing the Spread of Infection in the Workplace

Navarro County will ensure a clean workplace, including the regular cleaning of objects and areas that are frequently used, such as bathrooms, breakrooms, conference rooms, door handles and railings. A committee will be designated to monitor and coordinate events around an infectious disease outbreak, as well as to create work rules that could be implemented to promote safety through infection control.

We ask all employees to cooperate in taking steps to reduce the transmission of infectious disease in the workplace. The best strategy remains the most obvious—frequent hand washing with warm, soapy water; covering your mouth whenever you sneeze or cough; and discarding used tissues in wastebaskets. We will also install alcohol-based hand sanitizers throughout the workplace and in common areas.

Unless otherwise notified, our normal attendance and leave policies will remain in place. Individuals who believe they may face particular challenges reporting to work during an infectious disease outbreak should take steps to develop any necessary contingency plans. For example, employees might want to arrange for alternative sources of child care should schools close and/or speak with supervisors about the potential to work from home temporarily or on an alternative work schedule.

Limiting Travel

All nonessential travel should be avoided. Employees who travel as an essential part of their job should consult with management on appropriate actions. Business-related travel outside the United States will not be authorized.

Employees should avoid crowded public transportation when possible. Alternative scheduling options, ride-share resources and/or parking assistance will be provided on a case-by-case basis. Contact human resources for more information.

Telecommuting

Telework requests will be handled on a case-by-case basis. While not all positions will be eligible, all requests for temporary telecommuting should be submitted to your manager for consideration.

Staying Home When III

Many times, with the best of intentions, employees report to work even though they feel ill. We provide paid sick time and other benefits to compensate employees who are unable to work due

to illness. Please see Navarro County Personnel Policy Manual, SECTION 2: EMPLOYEE COMPENSATION AND BENEFITS. During an infectious disease outbreak, it is critical that employees do not report to work while they are ill and/or experiencing the following symptoms: fever in excess of 100 degrees, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, body aches, headache, chills and fatigue. Currently, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends that people with an infectious illness such as the flu remain at home until at least 24 hours after they are free of fever (100 degrees F or 37.8 degrees C) or signs of a fever without the use of fever-reducing medications. Employees who report to work ill will be sent home in accordance with these health guidelines.

Requests for Medical Information and/or Documentation

If you are out sick or show symptoms of being ill, it may become necessary to request information from you and/or your health care provider. In general, we would request medical information to confirm your need to be absent, to show whether and how an absence relates to the infection, and to know that it is appropriate for you to return to work. As always, we expect and appreciate your cooperation if and when medical information is sought.

Confidentiality of Medical Information

Our policy is to treat any medical information as a confidential medical record. In furtherance of this policy, any disclosure of medical information is in limited circumstances with supervisors, managers, first aid and safety personnel, and government officials as required by law.

Social Distancing Guidelines for Workplace Infectious Disease Outbreaks

In the event of an infectious disease outbreak, Navarro County may implement these social distancing guidelines to minimize the spread of the disease among the staff.

During the workday, employees are requested to:

- 1. Avoid meeting people face-to-face. Employees are encouraged to use the telephone, online conferencing, e-mail or instant messaging to conduct business as much as possible, even when participants are in the same building.
- 2. If a face-to-face meeting is unavoidable, minimize the meeting time, choose a large meeting room and sit at least one yard from each other if possible; avoid person-to-person contact such as shaking hands.
- 3. Avoid any unnecessary travel and cancel or postpone nonessential meetings, gatherings, workshops and training sessions.
- 4. Do not congregate in work rooms, pantries, copier rooms or other areas where people socialize.
- 5. Bring lunch and eat at your desk or away from others (avoid lunchrooms and crowded restaurants).
- 6. Encourage members and others to request information and orders via phone and email in order to minimize person-to-person contact. Have the orders, materials and information ready for fast pick-up or delivery.

Outside activities

Employees might be encouraged to the extent possible to:

- 1. Avoid public transportation or carpooling (walk, cycle, drive a car) or go early or late to avoid rush-hour crowding on public transportation.
- 2. Avoid recreational or other leisure classes, meetings, activities, etc., where employees might come into contact with contagious people.
