ORDER REGARDING FACE COVERINGS

Pursuant to the Supreme Court Of Texas Thirty-Eighth Emergency Order Regarding The COVID-19 State of Disaster and the Best Practices for All Court Proceedings as issued by the Office of Court Administration, the Court issues the following order in regards to face coverings: Cloth face coverings are encouraged of unvaccinated court participants or individuals planning to enter courtrooms or court-related offices while in the courthouse or a court building. Participants or individuals who are fully vaccinated are not required to wear a face covering. However, a court still possesses broad inherent authority to control proceedings in their courtrooms, and pursuant to that authority, they can require individuals in their courtroom to wear face coverings. Furthermore, a court may require any person entering the courthouse or court building in which they preside to wear a facial covering while in the courthouse or court building. Courts and court personnel are prohibited from inquiring whether or not a court participant or individual has or has not been vaccinated. This order will expire August 1, 2021 unless modified, extended, or vacated by the Texas Supreme Court or this Court.
