Position Title: Therapist/Advocate

Reports To: Director of Clinical Services and Executive Director, and if applicable, Clinical Supervisor

General Description: Working in a multi-agency team environment, the Therapist provides individual, family, and group therapy to child victims of abuse and their non-offending family members under the supervision of the Director of Clinical Services. While under clinical supervision, caseload may be lowered appropriately.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

- Provide assessment and evidence-based intervention to child abuse victims and their non-offending family members.
- Provide crisis intervention/safety assessment to clients if requested by Forensic Interviewer.
- Participate in Court proceedings as required.
- Maintain up-to-date case files including progress notes, treatment plans, assessments, etc.
- Attend monthly Child Protection Team meetings.
- Attend training and conferences as required.
- Maintain current state licensure and/or certifications.
- Participate in special events.
- Participate in supervision as needed.
- Complete intake documents with families and provide support during forensic interviews as needed
- Assist clients, families, and other staff members in providing direct services
- Any other duties assigned.

Qualifications and Skills:

* Possess a Texas LPC or LCSW license, or post-graduate license under supervision.

- Master's degree in social work, counseling, or other related field.
- Some evening hours required.
- Bilingual highly desirable
- Good written and oral communication skills.
